and one Labor of Land; and the said
Board having investigated said claim
by the oath of said claimant and
the evidence of his good and cred-
itable witnesses in the terms prescribed
by Law; Do hereby certify that the
said claimant, Charles Fordtran
is entitled to Three Quarters of a
League and one Labor of land as
his Head Right, and that the said
Fordtran immigrated to Texas in the
year eighteen hundred and thirty one.

 labors or three quarters of a league, and one labor of land, situated
 on the S.W. side of the Guadalupe river and distant from Gonzales
 some six miles. This being the quantity of land to which he is entitled
 by virtue of his certificate issued to him from the Board of Land
 commissioners for the County of Austin - It begins at the S.W. corner
 of Survey N. 7 in class N. 3. of one league of land which was deeded
 to James B. Patrick; from which there is a post oak marked \times bears

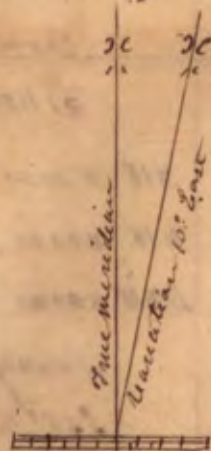
